a. The amendment is based on estimates of expenditures from increased receipts and balances

not budgeted or considered in the current budget. There will be no increase in taxes to be paid in the fiscal year ending June 30, 2022. The budget certification has four legal expenditure classifications for all District funds taken as a whole, including the

General Fund, Management Fund, PPEL Fund, Capital Pro Funds, Debt Service Fund, Projects Student Activity Fund, Food & Nutrition Fund and Day Care Fund. Each classification has been amended to a level sufficient to allow the District to spend beginning balances and unanticipated miscellaneous income. Amending the budget in this fashion on an annual basis allows the district to comply with the Code of Iowa, which requires that school district expenditures not exceed the 'published" budget in any one of the four functional areas.

2022-2023 Fiscal Year Certi-8 fied District Budget

a. The Board of Education is required by State Code to publish a fiscal year 2023 Proposed Budget. hold a public hearing, and certify budget and tax levy rates by April 15, 2022. The Fiscal Year 2023 Pro-posed Budget is premised on Supplemental Assistance (SSA) growth of 2.5%, which was approved by the legislature and signed by the Governor.

b. The District Fiscal Year 2023 levy rate is proposed to be \$10.99 per \$1,000 of taxable valuation. On March 21, 2022 the Board of Education approved publication of the proposed Fiscal Year 2023 District budget and scheduled a public hearing on Monday April 11, 2022 to allow public comment regarding the Fiscal Year 2023 District budget with a proposed total levy rate of \$10.99955.
